Small Classes

Accelerated Program

The Doctor of Physical Therapy program is offered in an accelerated format that will allow you to complete the program in 2.5 years. This gives you a jump start on earning your licensure and applying for jobs.



Prerequisite Courses

All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of C or better (C- does not meet this requirement). Courses older than 10 years old will not be accepted. Online courses are not accepted for biology, anatomy, physiology, physics, or chemistry. In the event a course with an online lecture is paired with a face-to-face lab, this may be acceptable. Please contact the School of Physical Therapy for verification. No more than two prerequisite courses may be in progress during the spring semester prior to the FSC School of Physical Therapy start date.

- General Biology I with Lab (4 hours)
- General Biology II with Lab (4 hours)
- Human Anatomy and Physiology I with Lab OR Human Anatomy with Lab (4 hours)
- Human Anatomy and Physiology II with Lab OR Human Physiology with Lab (4 hours)
- General Chemistry I with Lab (4 hours)
- General Chemistry II with Lab (4 hours)
- Physics I with Lab (4 hours)
- Physics II with Lab (4 hours)
- General Psychology (3 hours)
- One Additional Psychology Course (3 hours) such as Lifespan
 Development or Abnormal Psychology
- Statistics (3 hours)

Application Requirements

- Completed PTCAS application
- Official transcripts of all academic work
- Bachelor's degree in any discipline from a regionally accredited institution
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 in the last 60 credit hours of coursework
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 for all prerequisite courses
- The Graduate Record Examination (GRE) is required for admission. The GRE code for Florida Southern College/PTCAS is 4525.
- A minimum of 25 hours of volunteer and/or paid work experience in a PT setting.
- Two letters of recommendation. One from a Licensed Physical Therapist (from your volunteer experience or work experience in a PT setting). One from one of the following areas: a college-level faculty member who had you in a class or was your program advisor, supervisor/employer, teaching assistant, pre-PT advisor, or collegiate-level coach.
- On-campus interview (invitation only)
- A résumé may be required for students who are offered an interview by the school.

Application materials should be submitted electronically via PTCAS.

Financial Aid

Students are eligible for private scholarships as well as federal loans.
