It is my pleasure to welcome you with an introduction to the nursing programs at Florida Southern College. The nursing programs at Florida Southern College are committed to educational excellence, providing opportunities that integrate cultural competence and ethics into nursing practice, and fostering personal and professional growth for the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral level nursing student. Faculty pride themselves on creating a transformative and supportive learning environment, one that emphasizes engaged learning, student-faculty collaboration and academically-based service to the community.

Students are prepared in an atmosphere of compassionate caring to uphold professional standards and ethics, and to reflect Judeo-Christian values and ideals. We consider it essential that every nurse understands the impact of a changing health care delivery system upon patient health and the profession of nursing. Toward this end, nursing students at Florida Southern College are prepared to communicate effectively as part of an interprofessional team and to provide compassionate, evidence-based, patient-centered care.

Students complete coursework that combines theory and clinical practice for a hands-on experience, advancing their skills through distinguished practicum internships. We offer a 4-year direct-entry BSN program that prepares students for licensure and entry into professional nursing practice. We also offer a master's degree program with four tracks that prepare students for advanced nursing practice: Family Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner, Nursing Administrative Leadership, and Nurse Educator. A post-baccalaureate certificate in Nursing Administrative Leadership and post-masters certificates in Family Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner, and Nurse Educator are also offered.

Those nurses interested in the highest level of practice-focused education can pursue a Doctor of Nursing Practice at Florida Southern College. This program of study prepares graduates for a leadership trajectory at various levels in clinical and administrative healthcare environments through advanced competencies in leadership, evidence-based practice, quality improvement, informatics, health care analytics, health policy, and clinical practice. Our faculty has designed a convenient online format specifically tailored to meet the needs of working health care professionals and to provide the flexibility and engaged learning that the community has come to expect from FSC.

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MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (MSN)

At Florida Southern, our Master of Science in Nursing program lets you build on the foundations of your BSN and focus on a specific area of advanced nursing. Along with cutting-edge technology and personalized attention from accessible and impressively credentialed full-time faculty, our program features four distinct curriculum tracks, each addressing a vital area in health care.

MSN Tracks:

- **Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner**
Gain the ability to diagnose and treat patients 13 years and older in primary care settings.
- **Family Nurse Practitioner**
Be prepared to provide and direct care to families including adults and children in primary care settings.
- **Nursing Administrative Leadership**
This track is designed to provide nurse managers and clinical nurse leaders with the skills and knowledge necessary to guide daily operations in a variety of healthcare settings.
- **Nurse Educator**
This track prepares you to teach in an academic or healthcare setting by giving you expertise in teaching strategies and learning principles.

Delivery

Nurse Practitioner students meet once per week on campus for their classroom courses. The Nursing Administrative Leadership and Nurse Educator programs are delivered fully online.

DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE (DNP)

The demands of the rapidly changing and complex health care environment require the highest levels of scientific knowledge and practice expertise.

Overview

The DNP program prepares graduates to design and lead system-level improvements to achieve excellent patient care and practice outcomes. This program is a leadership focused post-master's program of study designed to prepare graduates in health care policy and advocacy, finance, information systems, project management and organizational leadership. Emphasis is on the application of evidence for the improvement and enhancement of patient care and health care delivery systems.

Delivery

To accommodate the busy schedules of working nursing professionals, our program coursework is delivered fully online.

Program Strengths

Our DNP program faculty have the teaching and practical experience required to prepare students for the highest level of independent nursing practice. The development of personal relationships with faculty and classmates is fostered by small class sizes and personalized instruction. 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CERTIFICATES

At no time in history has there been more of a demand for professionals to possess additional knowledge and credentials in the rapidly changing world of healthcare.

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate

Program Overview

Our Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Nursing Administrative Leadership allows nurses who desire additional credentials to build upon the foundation of their BSN degree. Designed for current and aspiring nurse managers and clinical leaders, this program will prepare students who wish to grow in their role and increase their knowledge in a variety of healthcare settings.

Delivery

In this certificate program, students will complete the required courses fully online.

Program Strengths

The courses will prepare the student to work in the fields of nursing leadership or be qualified for a promotion in their current workplace. The certificate can be completed in only 2 semesters (15 credit hours). Courses completed for the certificate are viewed as non-degree credits. Should a student decide to pursue the full Master of Science in Nursing in this track, credit from the certificate program will apply towards the MSN degree. Courses must be successfully completed with a minimum grade of B in the certificate program and would accelerate completion allowing students to earn their degree in as few as three semesters plus the clinical hour requirement.

Post-Master's Certificate

Program Overview & Design

Our Post-Master's Certificate program allows you to build upon the foundation of your MSN degree. These programs are designed to meet the needs of Master's prepared nurses seeking to expand their career opportunities to address areas of vital need in healthcare. The nurse educator certificate enables you to combine your professional expertise with a passion for teaching.

The nurse practitioner certificate programs provide two pathways depending on current licensure and certification status:

1. Master's-prepared nurse practitioners who are already certified and licensed can complete the program and become eligible for certification in a second population focused area of practice.
2. Master's-prepared nurses who have earned an MSN generalist degree or an MSN degree in another area of practice specialization can complete the requirements for initial certification as a nurse practitioner.
