Florida Southern's School of Education is dedicated to prepare those who are looking to enter the field of education. This program is designed for individuals interested in becoming a teacher and earning a curriculum and instruction degree that provides advanced classroom teaching skills through research-based strategies and techniques. This degree is focused on transformational teaching methods including active, student-centered, collaborative, experiential, and problem-based learning. These methods combined with the examination of how dynamic relationships between teachers, students, and a shared body of knowledge in the transformational teaching field will promote increased student performance, personal growth, and explore the positive impact that highly effective instructional leaders make on their students.

Early Admission (4+1 MAT)

Students are encouraged to apply for admission during their junior year. If admitted, seniors may enroll in one graduate course during their first semester and one graduate course during their second semester.

Convenient Schedule

- Scheduling is flexible and convenient for professionals with full-time employment.
- 100% of the courses are delivered online with the exception of your student teaching internship within a Polk County Public School and an on-campus course seminar.

Small Classes

Highly distinguished faculty are dedicated to supporting students in earning this degree. In addition to dedicated faculty, you will have small classes which will provide one-on-one attention and allow you to learn in an online format with your cohort.



Academic Advisor

Admission Requirements

- Completed online application (students are encouraged to apply for admission during their junior year)
- Must have 93+ credit hours completed at the start of the program
- GPA of a 3.0 or higher
- MAT in Transformational Curriculum and Instruction Director Approval
- Photocopy of ID, passport, or driver’s license
- Completion of a background check clearance from the Polk County School Board (PCSB)

*An interest inventory may be required

Financial Aid

Undergraduate financial aid is available during enrollment prior to undergraduate graduation. After a student graduates with an undergraduate degree, graduate financial aid will become available. Program Costs

Admitted undergraduate students will be allowed to complete a maximum of six credit hours of graduate work. These credits will count toward their MAT degree requirements. Any MAT courses attempted in the fall or spring semesters before receiving the undergraduate degree will be charged at the traditional undergraduate full-time tuition rate. Graduate courses taken after the student receives their undergraduate degree will be billed at the current MAT per credit hour rate.
