Enjoy samples of Moc classes that will provide a glimpse into the engaged learning environment embraced by FSC, led by Dr. Bernheim, Dr. Hamilton, Dr. Burke, and Dr. Shelby. Course descriptions:

The Binding of Isaac: Throughout the Jewish and Christian traditions, theologians have wrestled with the biblical story of God "testing" Abraham by commanding him to kill his son, Isaac. Join Associate Professor of Religion Dr. Brian Hamilton to read and discuss this story together, working to understand and articulate your own moral reactions to the text.

Dr. Kyle Burke's class will play Domineering, a board game with extremely simple rules. After the class practices against each other, they will play as a team against the professor. Following that, we will learn about the math we can use to help figure out which player is winning and use that to strategize which move to make. If there is enough time, we will talk about what would be necessary to implement the game on a computer system and potentially even play another related game, No-Can-Do.

A Martian Sends a Postcard Home: What would you think of Earth if you were just experiencing it for the first time? Creative writing can be a vehicle for all kinds of expression, and Professor of English Dr. Erica Bernheim will guide you through a Martian's poetic impressions of everyday objects, while also helping you find ways to improve your own creative writing skills, whether you're an aspiring poet, novelist, or even an undercover extraterrestrial guest.
